MILITARY FUNERAL HONORS: The National Defense Act of 2000 ([Public Law 106-65](#)) authorizes Military Funeral Honors to Active Duty Soldiers, Retirees and Veterans. UPDATE ON ID CARDS FOR RETIREES AND DEPENDENTS

ID cards that expired on or after January 1, 2020, are authorized for use through June 30, 2021. However, retirees and dependents with expired ID cards are encouraged to make an appointment for a new ID card as soon as possible to avoid the anticipated rush in June and beyond. The new, more secure, ID card incorporates an updated design and security features to deter counterfeiting and fraud, and are printed on plastic cardstock. They are now available in most ID card issuing offices, including in Rochester, NY. New cards will not be issued solely for the purpose of obtaining the new cards. Individuals with an indefinite (INDEF) expiration date on their current ID card should wait until later this summer to have their new card issued. On February 15, 2021, *Compeer Rochester* announced its merger with the Honeoye, NY-based *OASIS Adaptive Sports, Inc.* This merger will allow CompeerCORPS to expand services in the region by including outdoor adventures for veterans with disabilities. All services are free of cost to qualified veterans.

CompeerCORPS is the Veteran-run arm of Compeer connecting Veterans of all branches and service eras in group activities, recreation, and transportation services. **OASIS (Outdoor Adventures for Sacrifice in Service) Adaptive Sports, Inc.**, is a non-profit organization offering instruction, equipment, and support to disabled military veterans in a variety of sports activities. Established in 2009, its mission is to provide disabled veterans the instruction, equipment, and support to participate in outdoor recreational experiences, and thereby to help them regain their physical and mental health and aid their transition back into the mainstream of life. SURVIVORS AND BURIAL BENEFITS KIT

Help Your Loved Ones to be Prepared

The VA offers a *Survivors and Burial Benefits Kit* to assist Veterans and their families with pre-need planning. The kit includes a guide through possible end-of-life and survivors' benefits eligibility and makes it easy to keep your personal information all in one place for you and your loved ones. The Kit gives a description of each burial benefit, instructions on how to apply, and where to go to get assistance.

The Planning Your Legacy: VA Survivors and Burial Benefits Kit covers:

- Pre-need eligibility for National Cemetery burial or memorialization
- Memorial or burial flags
- Government headstones or markers
- Medallions
- Presidential Memorial Certificates (PMC)
- Burial benefits and burial automatic payments
- Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)
- Dependents Educational Assistance Program (DEA)
- Marine Gunnery Sergeant John David Fry Scholarship
- Survivor's pension
- Special monthly pension benefits
- The Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs (CHAMP-VA)
- Home loan guaranty
- Veterans Month of Death benefits
- VA life insurance

Other features include tips on how to fill out applications with examples of completed forms. These tips and examples give applicants a better understanding of how to properly fill out applications.

The VA encourages Veterans and service members to discuss their military service with their dependents, as well as planning their legacy. Families and survivors should know where to locate service medical records, discharge documents, VA disability ratings, and other information. These details will be beneficial to survivors as they prepare to apply for VA benefits. Families and survivors should keep this kit in storage so that it will be available when needed. THE NATIONAL PERSONNEL RECORDS CENTER RE-OPENING

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the NPRC had been closed and only completing emergency requests. On March 8, 2021, the NPRC began a phased expansion of its on-site workforce. NOTIFY DFAS ABOUT LIFE-CHANGING EVENTS

Retirees need to check and update their retired pay account as appropriate. If a retiree gets married, loses a spouse, or has a child, and DFAS isn't notified within the one-year deadline, then a retiree may be barred from covering his/her loved one. Keeping your account up-to-date includes making sure your mailing address, email address, banking information, and your beneficiaries are current. **Failing to update your SBP beneficiary could have financial consequences:** If you do not inform DFAS of a divorce, you could forfeit a refund of overpaid premiums. Events like divorce or remarriage change the beneficiary status of your account. If you have not notified DFAS of changes like this, you may have an invalid beneficiary designation.
